

80th Anniversary of D-Day June 6, 2024



Patriots Point commemorates the 80th anniversary of the USS Laffey's participation in Operation Neptune, the Naval phase of the D-Day invasion.

History Comes Alive on the Laffey at Patriots Point

To commemorate the 80th anniversary of the Invasion of Normandy, Patriots Point Naval and Maritime Museum welcomed visitors aboard the USS Laffey DD-724 to learn about the role our destroyer played in this historic event. Living history re-enactors were present throughout the USS Laffey sharing the part the ship played at Normandy. US Navy destroyer veterans were also be present throughout the ship to discuss the role of destroyers in naval defense.

At 2pm on 6 June in the USS Laffey theater, guest speaker and PPDA Board Member, James Smith, shared about his grandfather, Lt. Paul Smith who served on board the Laffey at Normandy and Okinawa. He was followed by guest speaker, and Patriots Point Volunteer of the Year, Bill Cassasa at approximately 2:20pm to discuss the role of a destroyer in naval warfare and share information about weapons operations.



History of the Laffey at Normandy

The USS Laffey DD-724 was part of Operation Neptune, the naval phase of the D-Day invasion. Under command of Admiral Sir Bertram Ramsey of the UK's Royal Navy, the fleet was responsible for the sweeping of mines and marking channels. They also provided transportation of troops and equipment to the beaches, landing the troops and supporting them with gunfire and reinforcement, and resupply by sea. In transit, the force was screened by the destroyers

USS Jeffers, Obrien, Glennon, Barton, Laffey, Meredith, the French corvettes Aconit and Renoncule, plus 3 trawlers, 7 Patrol Crafts, 7 Submarine Chasers and 7 Motor Launch vessels.

The USS Laffey provided support to the Utah Beach landing site. Twenty-four hours after the first wave had landed, 66,000 US troops had crossed the beaches and within 7 days the number had grown to 250,000.

They sent a piece of the ship's hull, a valve control wheel, and a damage control plug to Normandy.

"The USS Yorktown Foundation is immensely proud to join hands with Patriots Point and the Commemorative Air Force in events like these, which serve as important reminders of the sacrifices made and the valor displayed by our heroes. Through our collective efforts, we ensure that the legacy of those who served lives on, inspiring and educating future generations about the importance of courage, honor, and service to our country."



John served aboard USS Laffey 1959-1962 homeported in Norfolk, VA. John describes the operation of the USS Laffey 600 psi boilers: cold iron watch, lighting off a boiler, going to full steam power, blowing tubes, etc. John is the principle advocate and technician to open the USS Laffey After Boiler Room to the public at the Patriots Point Naval & Maritime Museum. John describes himself as just a "snipe" doing his job.

USS Laffey Ship Store Display From Chip Honsinger: Patriots Point and we are attempting to further outfit the ship's store with vintage (1950-60) items that would have been for sale when Laffey was at sea. Incidentally, the store was in a different, smaller location at that time,

opposite sick bay. Now visitors can see these items through the window in the door. We have plenty of cigarette cartons, for example, and we would particularly like to obtain a cigar box, some paper match books, stationery or writing tablet (for letters), empty box of envelopes (not "modern" peel and seal), a vintage shaving mug or whatever we used at the time (we have a brush), soap wrappers, hair tonic bottles, sunglasses, etc. Items might look older than they would have in the 50s, but if they are reasonably clean that is good enough for 2023.

Bottles and boxes may be empty. Please bring them to the ship when you come.

The Laffey Ship Store was small, manned by a storekeeper with not much more than standing room. The customer stands outside the windowed door and talks over the counter in the door after seeing items displayed on two or three shelves behind the storekeeper, each shelf 3-4 feet long. The Ship Store and the Post Office were very popular and important for everyone aboard ship. When open crew members were usually waiting in a line for their turn.






